DEVONPORT CC CLAIMS COASTAL ENGINEERING & BELTING T20 COMMUNITY CUP

Congratulations to Devonport Cricket Club, who capped off a successful T20 campaign on Sunday by winning the Coastal Engineering and Belting Pty Ltd T20 Community Cup.

Earlier in the day, BCL T20 Premiers Riana CC faced off against MVCA T20 Premiers Don CC. Batting first, Riana posted 134, led by a quick 45 from captain-coach Tom Triffitt. Curt Woolley (3-22) and Brent Burgess (3-24) were the pick of the Don bowlers. In reply, Tom Triffitt (3-15) and Alfie Jackson (3-12) tore through the Don batting lineup, dismissing them for 94 in the 18th over, securing Riana's spot in the final.

Facing Devonport CC in the decider, Riana managed 96, with Tom Triffitt (20) top-scoring. Devonport's Dilan Sandagirigoda was the standout bowler, taking 3-4.

Devonport then cruised to victory, chasing down the target in the 14th over for the loss of just three wickets. Miles Barnard finished unbeaten on 47 and was awarded Man of the Match for his performance.

PLAYER DOWNGRADING RULES

A reminder to clubs that as per the CNW Rules following this rounds matches clubs will need to apply for downgrades for any players who have played 75% of their matches in a higher grade to be able to play in a lower grade.

Please see below the full rule. 13. Downgrading's (a) Following the completion of the first roster match scheduled to commence on or after the 1st February in each season no player who has played at least 75% (rounded up) of their matches in a higher grade (except Greater Northern Raiders CTPL players) shall play in a lower grade to that which they are currently playing during the remainder of the roster season without the permission of the Community Competitions Officer.

Part matches played in a higher grade as a replacement player are to be disregarded for the purpose of downgradings.
