PLAYHQ LADDERS - NET RUN RATE CALCULATION ERROR - IMPORTANT INFORMATION

This week an error was identified in the way PlayHQ Admin is currently calculating Net Run Rate on ladders. Since then our local Community Cricket staff have been doing audits and checks into local ladders to investigate and have identified similar issues happening in this association. Please see relevant information below.

The errors relating to Net Run Rate on PlayHQ Admin ladders have been found to occur when:

- A match is abandoned part way through the game but a result is not achieved (e.g. Team A bats makes 4/160 and Team B does not get to bat) local association rules and the MCC Laws of Cricket state that 'Only matches where a result has been obtained shall be used to determine the Net Run Rate' so this is an error in the way this is being calculated currently.
- When a team does not have 11 batters and is bowled all out (i.e. loses less than 10 wickets but is all out) –
 in Net Run rate calculations when a team is 'all out' the overs are rounded up to the maximum number of
 overs available. If 'all out' is not selected correctly then the overs bowled or faced would be effected which
 effects the way NRR is calculated.

The solution to amend ladders to be accurate and work around the errors are:

- In Abandoned Matches change the 'Match Result' in the Game Day menu on PlayHQ Admin to be 0/0 off 0 overs vs 0/0 off 0 overs this helps to remove the run made/conceded and overs bowled/faced off the ladder for the purpose of NRR. Noting that matches played and individual players stats are still counted.
- In matches where a team does not have 11 batters and is bowled all out (i.e. loses less than 10 wickets but is all out) ensure the box of 'All Out' is ticked and that the 'maximum overs' is the correct amount – this helps to ensure the overs bowled or face are accurately represented even in matches where teams do not have 11 batters

Cricket Tasmania have been working through the alterations as outlined above to ensure ladders accurately represent how they should be presenting. These should now be updated and accurate in the PlayHQ system ow.

Assessing the CNW Ladders after making the necessary adjustments, there has been minimal changes, with none across all Senior Competitions, but one key change in the CNW Under 16s with this outlined below.

Sheffield (initially 2nd) and Devonport (initially 3rd) swapping positions. This means Devonport qualified to host the 2nd vs 3rd Final against Sheffield this weekend however as the Devonport Oval is unavailable due to the GNR Women's match, the match will remain at Sheffield. Devonport will however qualify for the Grand Final if the match is Washed Out.

Cricket Tasmania understands that this may have some impacts on clubs who have been basing their current ladder standings on current NRR and playing matches accordingly, however we believe ensuring ladder accuracy is important as we approach the business end of the season. Ultimately this an error due to the PlayHQ system and is out of both CT's and the associations control however we understand this may have some unfortunate negative flow on effects.

PLAYER DOWNGRADING RULES

A reminder to clubs that as per the CNW Rules following this rounds matches clubs will need to apply for downgrades for any players who have played 75% of their matches in a higher grade to be able to play in a lower grade.

Please see below the full rule. 13. Downgrading's (a) Following the completion of the first roster match scheduled to commence on or after the 1st February in each season no player who has played at least 75% (rounded up) of their matches in a higher grade (except Greater Northern Raiders CTPL players) shall play in a lower grade to that which they are currently playing during the remainder of the roster season without the permission of the Community Competitions Officer.

Part matches played in a higher grade as a replacement player are to be disregarded for the purpose of downgradings.

PLAYHQ STATS UPDATES AND ASSISTANCE

Throughout the season, it has been noted that some match details—such as catches and run-outs—have been missed when entering scores into **PlayHQ** or during **Live Scoring**. Additionally, if a player has participated as a fill-in before officially registering, their stats and qualification match can be updated accordingly.

UTAS CRADLE COAST LOCAL LEARNNG LEADERS – CLUB ENGAGEMENT

The University of Tasmania (UTAS) Regional Partnerships team on the Cradle Coast are being funded in 2025 to deliver a community research trial. The funding through ACSES (Australian Centre for Student Equity and Success) will trial an intervention delivered in community organisations across the North West aiming to raise aspirations for higher education amongst groups of Local Learning Leaders who can then support people in their networks around education and career decision making.

The project is an opportunity to test the widely held view within our communities that volunteers and administrators in our community organisations can be a strong influence on the members they engage with and therefore can inform and shape a person's learning and career aspirations through their existing networks.

UTAS are looking to engage with local clubs to participate in the research which will involve recruitment of participants from across their member base for data collection and in some cases participation in a one-off workshop. Activities will be planned and delivered with each participating organisation to fit in and around their operations.

A small one-off donation will be made to the clubs for their involvement and their leadership to engage participants. Whilst individual participants will receive a voucher for their time participating in the workshop and data collection. Details of which will be worked through with the clubs individually.

The project commences in February and will be completed over 12-months, with the data collection and workshops planned to be rolled out over 6 months from around May.

Whilst this initial research project will be the focus of the relationships established, the aim is that this will inform future opportunities for research and community engagement across the North West region.
