# Cricket Tasmania – Blast Participation Data

Junior Female Participation Data
North West Region Cricket Blast

**Total Female Blast Participants in Northern Region = 292** participants

#### Notes:

- •CT Programs were made up of a number of different type programs including
  - All Girls Colour Blast (Term 3 School Holidays and Summer Holidays) – 89 participants
  - School Based Blast Programs 47 participants
  - Low-Socio Blast Programs 92 participants
  - School Holiday Programs 13 participants
- •Girls made up 34.4% of our 850 Blast registrations in 2024/25 well above the National Avg. or states of 27%

# Girls Colour Blast Term 3 School Holiday Program:


### **COLOUR, CRICKET, WATER, FUN!**

# **CNW Women's Social / Development Comps Info**

- The CNW Women's Social League competition has been a great success, particularly over the last few years with strong growth and the move to a two competition 'split season model' being positively received
- A number clubs have been involved for a while in the CNW Women's Social League and have raised they wish for the formats to progress while some clubs are happy to continue the formats as they currently stand as they fulfil their need.
- Following some discussions with a number of CNW Women's Social League clubs late last season about the formats of the competition we propose a merger of the CNW Women's Social League and CNW Female Development League into a 'two-division' model has been proposed.
- Further information on the next slide covers how this could possibly look in reality.





## **CNW Women's Second Grade – Format Rules**

- The proposed model would have clubs split by last seasons ladder position in CNW
  Women's Social League competitions, and allowing for the clubs with both Female
  Development League and Women's Social League teams to have teams in both divisions.
- Any new clubs would start in Division 2 for their first season as a minimum.
- The rules would align with last season Female Development League (Division 1) and Women's Social League (Division 2) so that more advanced clubs were progressing in the formats they are playing (summary on next page).
- All games would be played on a Friday nights which aligns with the positive feedback from clubs on the timing of games and support they get as a result.
- Split season model (Spring and Summer rosters) would continue to operate to ensure shorter season commitment and that teams are playing in the correct division.







# **CNW Women's Second Grade – Format Rules**

Please see below summary table of rules from last seasons competitions and the key differences between the two competitions

<b>Development League Key Rules (Division 1)</b>	Social League Key Rules (Division 2)
Ball – games played with 142g 2-piece ball	Ball – games played with modified Aero-ball
<ul> <li>Overs – 20 overs per team and maximum of 8-ball overs</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Overs – 16 overs per team with wides and no-balls not re-bowled</li> </ul>
Pitch Length - 18 meters from stump to stump	• Pitch Length – 18 meters from stump to stump
Boundary Size – 45 meters maximum	Boundary Size – 40 meters maximum
Batting – Batters retire at 20 balls faced unless dismissed. Batters can return at the end of innings	<ul> <li>Batting – all batters face 12 balls including wides and no-balls. Batters swap ends if they get out</li> </ul>
• <b>Bowling</b> – All players must bowl 1 over except Wicket- Keeper. Max 4 overs per bowler.	<ul> <li>Bowling - all bowlers encouraged to bowl. Max 3 overs per bowler.</li> </ul>
• <b>Dismissals</b> – All dismissal types. Maximum of 8 wickets per team until they are 'all out'.	• <b>Dismissals</b> – no LBW. Unlimited dismissals per teams all players face their allotted balls.
<ul> <li>Team – 9 players on ground at any stage. Min 7 players for a match and max 11 players.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Team – 9 players on the ground at any stage. Min 5 players for a match.</li> </ul>
Scoring - Innings totals will be calculated when the eighth wicket falls or 20 overs have been bowled	<ul> <li>Scoring – Batting scored as per normal and bowling 4 runs per wicket taken to overall score</li> </ul>
