## CNW DOWNGRADING RULES – IMPORTANT REMINDER

A reminder to clubs that as per the CNW Rules starting this rounds matches clubs will need to apply for downgrades for any players who have played 75% of their matches in a higher grade to be able to play in a lower grade.

Please see below the full rule.

- 13. Downgrading's** (a) Following the completion of the first roster match scheduled to commence on or after the 1st February in each season no player who has played at least 75% (rounded up) of their matches in a higher grade (except Greater Northern Raiders CTPL players) shall play in a lower grade to that which they are currently playing during the remainder of the roster season without the permission of the Community Competitions Officer.
- Part matches played in a higher grade as a replacement player are to be disregarded for the purpose of downgrading.

## CNW LADDER ADJUSTMENTS – MEN'S 1<sup>ST</sup> AND 2<sup>ND</sup> GRADE

Following an audit of the CNW 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade ladders following some feedback from clubs, there has been a number of adjustments which have effected ladder points due to errors in closing off match results in two-Day matches.

The adjustments made are outlined below:

- **Ulverstone 1<sup>st</sup> Grade** – adjustment of two match results to be outright victories instead of two first innings victories which were in the system – as a result an additional 16 points are now on UDCC total.
- **Latrobe 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade** - adjustment of one match result to be an outright victory instead of a first innings victories which was in the system – as a result an additional 8 points are now on LCC total.

These adjustments have been made in PlayHQ now and ladders on the PlayCricket App should be updated accordingly (or will be very soon).

If clubs believe there may be any other errors in ladder points or bonus point calculations, please contact Cricket Tasmania staff.

## PLAYHQ STATS UPDATES AND ASSISTANCE

Throughout the season, it has been noted that some match details—such as catches and run-outs—have been missed when entering scores into PlayHQ or during Live Scoring. Additionally, if a player has participated as a fill-in before officially registering, their stats and qualification match can be updated accordingly.

To ensure all statistics and player awards are accurate at season's end, clubs with written records of missing catches, run-outs, or other discrepancies are encouraged to send these details to Mitch Jones ([mjones@crickettas.com.au](mailto:mjones@crickettas.com.au)) for assistance with updates.
