CNW WOMEN'S 1ST GRADE GRAND FINAL – SATURDAY FEBRUARY 28TH 2026

Congratulations to the **Sheffield CC** on taking out Saturday nights' Hursey Seafoods CNW 1st Grade Women's grand final against Wynyard.

Played in blustery conditions under lights at the Devonport Oval, the Mountaineers won the toss and elected to bowl first, and thanks to some tight and accurate bowling, were able to restrict the Tigers to 5-94 from their 20 overs. Montana Bradley was the best with the bat for Wynyard with an unbeaten 44, but she was unable to find anyone else to make a sizable contribution as the Sheffield attack, led by Sam Cotton (2-12) kept the boundaries to a minimum.

The Mountaineers' reply started well as Georgia Anderson and Kylie Bramich put on 37 for the opening wicket, with Anderson going on to make 33 before being bowled with the score on 53.

Georgia King (17) and Cotton (18 not out) then added a further 27 runs for the third wicket to put their team in sight of the title, with Cotton and Tayla Wigg combining for the winning runs with 15 balls remaining.

Anderson took out the Player of the Game award for her innings at the top of the order, which included five boundaries.

The win sees Sheffield claim its second CNW Women's title after success in the 2019-20 season.

AUSTRALIAN CRICKET INFRASTRUCTURE FUND 25/26 –APPLICATIONS CLOSE MARCH 27TH

Cricket Tasmania has opened applications for the 2025/26 Australian Cricket Infrastructure Fund (ACIF). Applications are live now and will close at midnight on 27 March 2026.

The structure is similar to that of previous years, with two categories of grants available: minor grants of \$500-\$15,000 and major grants of \$15,001-\$40,000. Strategic projects in excess of \$40,000 will also be considered and I would encourage you to reach out to us if you have a project of this nature.

CNW DOWNGRADING RULES – IMPORTANT REMINDER

A reminder to clubs that as per the CNW Rules starting this rounds matches clubs will need to apply for downgrades for any players who have played 75% of their matches in a higher grade to be able to play in a lower grade.

Please see below the full rule.

13. Downgrading's (a) Following the completion of the first roster match scheduled to commence on or after the 1st February in each season no player who has played at least 75% (rounded up) of their matches in a higher grade (except Greater Northern Raiders CTPL players) shall play in a lower grade to that which they are currently playing during the remainder of the roster season without the permission of the Community Competitions Officer.

Part matches played in a higher grade as a replacement player are to be disregarded for the purpose of downgrading.
