# **Greater Northern Cup**

#### Devonport 9/168 d South Launceston 106

For the second consecutive Saturday, only one Cricket North West team was able to prevail in the five Greater Northern Cup games, with Devonport producing an outstanding display on the road with the ball and in the field to defeat South Launceston by 62 runs.

After being only able to post a modest score of 9-168 from their 50 overs (Eli Sheean 46, Prasith Sudusinghe 39) at the NTCA No. 2 Ground, the Orions attack ripped through the host's batting line-up, reducing them to 9-75 before eventually bundling them out for 106 in the 27<sup>th</sup> over.

Toby Bellchambers (4-33) and Ben Tenaglia (3-33) were the main wicket takers for the visitors, while Sam Fogg claimed his 400<sup>th</sup> 1<sup>st</sup> Grade wicket as the Devonport fielders, led by coach Miles Barnard, held on to anything that was within reach.

### Mowbray 9/226 d Wynyard 225

Wynyard almost made it two wins for Coastal teams but agonizingly fell one run short against Mowbray in a thriller at Invermay Park.

Batting first, the home team compiled a handy total of 9-226 thanks to John Hayes' 71 and Spencer Hayes' 44, while Marcus Gee 4-42 led the visitor's attack.

The Tigers looked in be a spot of bother as they fell to 5-80 in the chase before the steady hand of veteran Gregg Sharman and Mason Hodgetts put on 103 for the sixth wicket.

Sharman's dismissal for 66 saw the visitors lose 3-15 to give Mowbray the advantage, but Hodgetts continued to give Wynyard hope as he reached his half-century until his run-out soon after left the team with nine runs to get off 16 balls with only one wicket remaining.

Gee and Jamin Hope got the equation down to only needing two runs off the final over, however, Gee was dismissed on the third ball, leaving the Tigers to ponder what might have been.

### Riverside 84 d Burnie 70

It was a close game of a vastly different kind in the Greater Northern Cup grand final rematch from last season at Windsor Park as Burnie fell to Riverside by 14 runs in a game dominated by the ball.

On a green wicket, the Blues were routed for just 84 in the 29<sup>th</sup> over as Josh Lamprey (4-8) and Shaun Redman (3-11) wreaked havoc.

However, any thoughts the Hurricanes had of an easy run chase under the sunny skies were blown away by the home side, who returned the favour and skittled the visitors for only 70 in the 25<sup>th</sup> over, with former Ulverstone premiership player Lyndon Stubbs (5-35) leading the charge.



























#### Latrobe 170 lt Launceston 9/168

In the only game on Coastal turf, Latrobe came away from its first home outing empty-handed as Launceston left the Latrobe Recreation Ground with a comfortable five-wicket triumph.

After being sent into bat on the new pitch, the Demons appeared well-placed for a competitive total at 2-92 courtesy of contributions from Tim Moore (35), Callan Morse (29) and Eamon Young (29).

But the Latrobe middle order failed to capitalise on the foundations laid, and they were bowled out for 170 in the 43<sup>rd</sup> over, with Dilan Sandagirigoda (4-26) the pick of the attack.

The Demons would have sensed they were in with a chance when the Lions were 3-48, but half centuries to Will Bennett and Charlie Taylor saw the visitors cruise home with 7.3 overs remaining.

### Westbury 9/252 d Sheffield 216

Sheffield's first game of the season was an unsuccessful one as it fell to Westbury at Ingamells Oval by 36 runs.

Led by 117 from Joel Lloyd, the Shamrocks put together an impressive total of 9-252, with young quick Tyson Crawford (3-44) the best of the bowlers.

The Mountaineers hit trouble early in the reply, falling to 3-38 before knocks from James Jennings (41) and Ethan Clark (79) gave them some hope.

But Westbury manage to always find a wicket when needed and dismissed Sheffield for 216 with 10 balls to go.

### Cricket North West - 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade

Ulverstone broke through for its first win of the season, defeating Wynyard by 24 runs in round three matches on Saturday.

Despite only making 135 from their 45 overs, the Black Caps successfully defended the total after bowling the Tigers out for 111 in the 40<sup>th</sup> over thanks to 4-15 from Jayden Beaumont.

Reigning premiers Devonport remains the only unbeaten team following a narrow three run win over Sheffield in a rematch of last season's decider.

Batting first, the Orions compiled 5-191 with Jade Doherty (65) and Lochie Reid (42) top scoring.

The Mountaineers got off to a great start through openers Blake Fidler (42) and Brock Bamford (57) before a five-wicket haul by Jake Glover put the brakes on the run chase.

Sheffield's lower order kicked again to take the game down to the wire, but they were all out for 188 with three balls remaining.

In the final game, Burnie proved too strong for Latrobe, easing to victory by five wickets at West Park.

Five wickets to Nathan Hayes restricted the Demons to 157, a total that the Hurricanes passed in the  $42^{nd}$  over thanks in part to Sean Ryan (47) and Nick Imms (49).





























## Cricket North West - Under 16's

Round two games on Sunday saw Burnie and Wynyard maintain their perfect starts to the season with wins over Latrobe and Ulverstone respectively.

An even performance with both bat and ball saw the Hurricanes defeat the Demons by 29 runs at West Park, while the Tigers still had eight wickets in hand as they passed the Black Caps' total of 132 in the 37<sup>th</sup> over, thanks to 58 not out from Maxwell Innes and a four-wicket haul from Fergus Gibbs.

In the final game, Sheffield proved too strong for Devonport, passing the Orions' total of 125 in the 31<sup>st</sup> over for the loss of only three wickets.
