



CRICKET NORTH WEST – REPORT No.6 (30 November 2025)

Greater Northern Cup

Burnie has recorded its second win of the season after upsetting semi-final aspirant Launceston in Saturday's eighth round of games in the Greater Northern Cup.

Sent into bat at the NTCA No.1 Ground, the Hurricanes found the going tough at times but were able to post a final score of 6-154 from their 50 overs thanks to 53 not out from Shaun Redman and some wayward bowling by the hosts.

Russi Sturzaker was on fire early in the Lions' reply, claiming the first three wickets to reduce them to 3-46, but at 4-109 the home team were favourites to claim the points.

However, the visitors never gave in, and thanks to efforts of Kurt Lamprey, Redman and Varun Nadesh, they took the next six wickets for just 21 runs to skittle the home team for just 130 in the 37th over.

Burnie's victory was the only triumph for CNW teams in what was another tough day at the office, with their Northern counterparts further strengthening their chances of holding all four semi-final positions with three rounds remaining.

Devonport came the closest to securing a win but went down to ladder leaders Westbury by two wickets in a thriller at the Devonport Oval.

The Orions made a disastrous start after electing to bat first, crumbling to 4-17 before a maiden half-century to Jade Doherty (64) and 44 from Rob French helped them end their 50 overs at a defendable 8-174.

The Shamrocks appeared to be in control at 4-136 thanks to Daniel Murfet's 78 until the hosts took three quick wickets to leave the game in the balance at 7-155 in the 46th over. But the visitors held their nerve and escaped with the victory with two balls remaining.

Ulverstone blew its chance to push for a top-four spot in a six-wicket loss to Mowbray at UCI Oval.

Led by 42 from Harry Dale, the Black Caps had laid the foundations for a good score at 3-137 in the 38th over. However, it was all downhill from there as the home team lost 7-15, including four ducks, to be bundled out for 152 in the 48th over.

The Eagles were rarely troubled in the chase and reached the target at the end of the 37th over to earn themselves a bonus point.

Latrobe put together one of its best scores for the season, but it wasn't enough to topple Riverside at Windsor Park.

Thanks to a season-high 86 from opener Callan Morse and 52 from captain Chris Boon in the middle order, the Demons were all out for 199 in the 48th over.





The Blues responded through Ben Hann's 89 and Peter New's 45 to be 2-168, and despite a late flurry of wickets from Duncan Grey (4-53), they prevailed with 14.5 overs remaining and three wickets in hand.

Sheffield's trip to the NTCA No.2 Ground proved unsuccessful, with South Launceston prevailing by 44 runs.

Batting first, the Knights looked set for a sizable score at 2-118 (Mackenzie Barker 55) but were restricted to 183 thanks to the efforts of Ethan Clark (4-44) and Logan Heazlewood (3-28) with the ball.

Sheffield started well in reply, reaching 0-37, but then lost 3-1 to be on the back foot from then on despite a half-century from Alex King, and were all out for 139 in the 43rd over.

CNW Second Grade Men

Ulverstone scored its most impressive win of the season in a nail-biting four-wicket victory over second-placed Burnie at West Park.

The Hurricanes were asked to bat first and would have been content with their innings, having made 3-220 through contributions from Robert Mason (82), Sean Ryan (55) and James Radcliff (46).

The Black Caps found batting conditions just as good in the afternoon as Jed Ling (90) and Drew Allen (80) put on 166 for the second wicket to knock over the majority of the target. However, Burnie hit back with late wickets, leaving the visitors needing four runs from the final over.

Coming in with two balls remaining, Cohen DeVries hit the winning runs from the first ball he faced.

Devonport returned to the winners list and remain at the top of the table after holding off Latrobe by 21 runs.

Asked to bat first, Lochie Reid (68) and Alex Forbes (47) helped guide the Orions to a score of 179, with Payton Fulton (3-9) the leading wicket-taker.

The Demons opened their chase on home turf with a 67-run partnership to put an upset on the cards, until the introduction of Lucas French (4-19) into the attack saw them fall to 5-94.

Peter Fulton's 35 kept the hosts in with a chance, but they ultimately fell for 158 with 11 balls left.

In the final game of the round, Wynyard easily accounted for Sheffield by six wickets.

Noah McCreddie (3-23) led a six-man Tigers attack that all claimed at least one wicket as the Mountaineers were skittled for 117 on their home deck.

Sam Drozd's unbeaten half-century gave the visitors an early finish as they reached the target with just under 23 overs remaining.

Georgia King's 42 not out was the lone highlight in the Mountaineers' innings of 7-90, a total the Tigers chased down in 10-1 overs as Montana Bradley (50 not out) scored her second half-century in as many games.

Latrobe maintained top spot on the ladder with a five-wicket triumph over Devonport at the Latrobe Recreation Ground

The Orions had no answer for the home team's attack as they were bundled out for 61.

The Demons were in early trouble in reply after falling to 4-18, but 30 from Payton Fulton guided them to the points in the 14th over.

CNW Under 16s

Latrobe has moved to the top of the table courtesy of a 44-run win against Devonport on Sunday.

Coming in at number eight, it was Tait Jeffrey's innings of 60 off 57 balls that gave the Demons a final score of 163. Tahj Wilson (4-20) was the best of the Devonport bowlers.

Angus Sanderson (3-13 and a run out) put the Orions in a hole early in the chase, and it was position they couldn't recover from as they were all out for 119.

Burnie relinquished its hold on first place when Ulverstone came away from West Park with a five-wicket victory – it's first for the season.

A four-wicket haul from Miller Hubbard (4-24) and three wickets to Lachlan Dobson (3-32) restricted the Hurricanes to 138 despite the best efforts from Judd Ryan (57).

The Black Caps' reply was sinking early as George Radcliff took 4-26, before an unbeaten 101-run partnership between Joel Allan (48 not out) and Samuel Maloney (40 not out) sealed the result with 5.5 overs left.

Wynyard jumped to third spot with a last-over triumph at home to Sheffield.

A 95-run partnership between captain Miller Jones (46) and Maklyn Jones (42 not out) gave the Mountaineers a score of 7-152 from their 40 overs

The Tigers appeared home and hosed at 3-131 before the visitors struck back through William Hughes (3-23) to keep the game alive. But the hosts remained resolute to reach the target with two balls to go.
